Paris, 24 April 2017 – During the General Meeting held on 20 April 2017 at Vila Vipolže, Slovenia, the

members of CEVI, the European Confederation of Independent Winegrowers, unanimously affirmed

their position concerning nutrition labelling and ingredients.

As a reminder, CEVI represents thousands of small winegrowing companies, whose products account

for the wealth of variety and fame of European wines.

Imposing a nutrition labelling requirement means constraining producers with a completely

unnecessary burden: wine, a natural product, is already sufficiently regulated with regard to its

production and labelling methods.

In addition, nutrition labelling poses a structural problem for those independent winegrowers whose

wines are produced directly from their own grapes and therefore have different characteristics every

year, depending on the weather conditions and a number of other factors. The independent

winegrowers will therefore have to change their labelling every year, as the final product is not

constant. This represents a totally disproportionate constraint and cost for a measure of questionable

effectiveness.

Finally, it is important to understand that wine is not merely an alcohol product like others. It is also a

cultural product whose broad diversity is a major asset for export, among other things. The addition

of extra labelling requirements will inevitably lead to increased standardisation in the sector, to the

detriment of European consumers.

Speaking at the end of the General Meeting, at which he had just been re-elected President, Thomas

Montagne explained that labelling containing an overload of information would not solve the problems

of alcoholism or obesity: "We do not understand the reasoning of the European Commission. When it

comes to wine, and especially the local wines that we produce, the addition of supplementary

information is not the key to healthy consumption. Prevention and education are other more effective

factors, and that is why CEVI has supported and been involved in the Wine In Moderation (WIM)

initiative for quite some time now".
